At this time he wrote a fragment of a play in which the protagonist Stone needs money for a life-saving operation for his child. Stone would prefer to prostitute his wife rather than prostitute his artistic integrity by writing advertising copy.

Animal Farm Illustrated Oct 31 2022 George Orwell's *Animal Farm* is a 1945 book about a group of animals on a farm who organise a revolution, and take over from their human owners to run the farm themselves.
